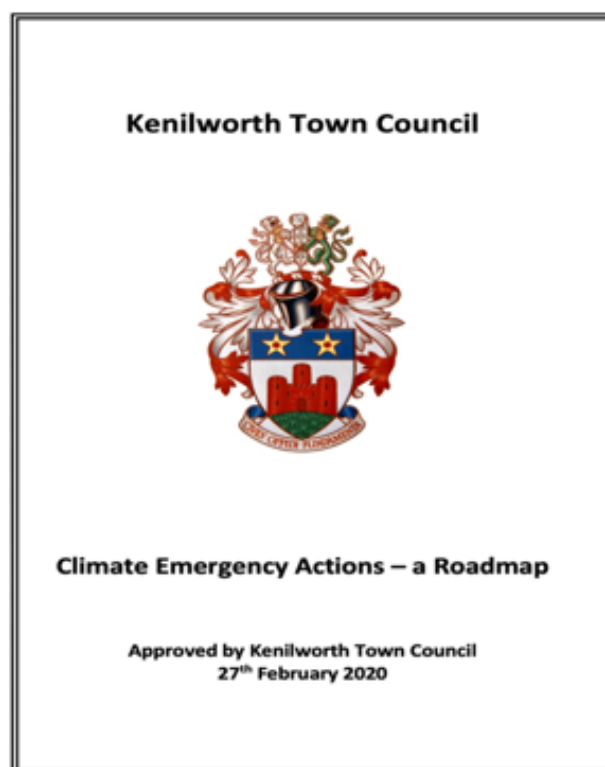
Kenilworth Climate Emergency - a Roadmap for Action

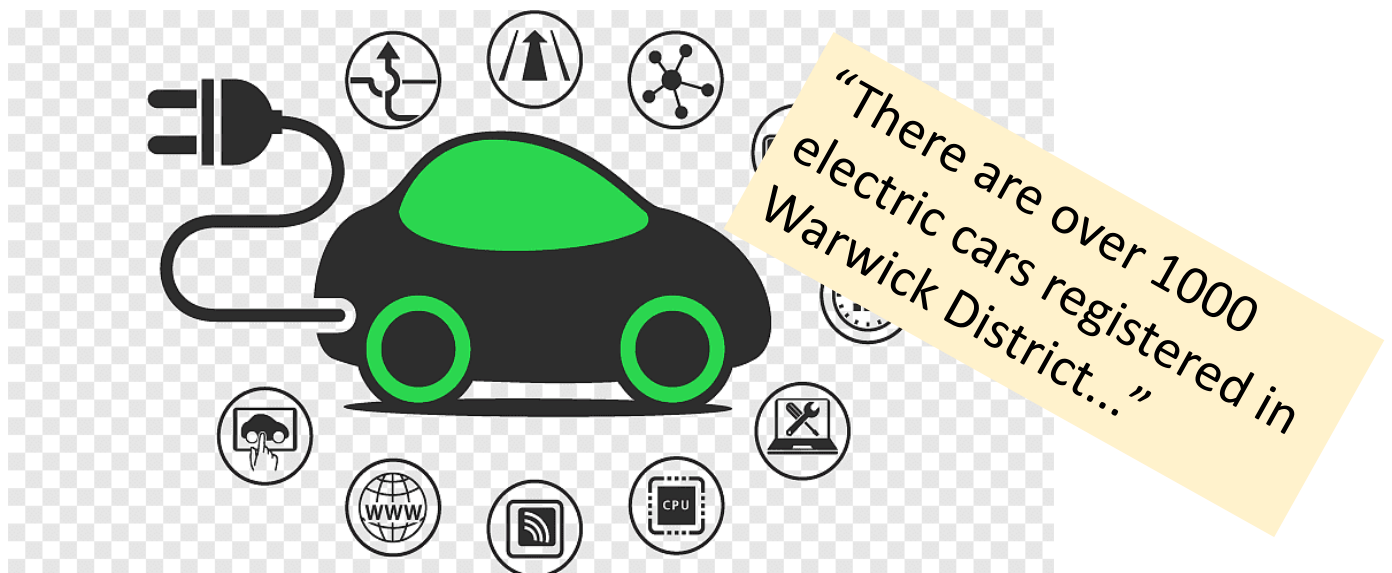

The winning entries will be displayed in an exhibition in Leamington Spa, and featured in the Warwickshire Open Studios brochure, to be published in May of 2021, and in the Warwick and Leamington Spa Courier.

For each participating school, Warwickshire Climate Alliance offers to run a school assembly on climate change and on the dilemmas of how to respond to it. This can be done remotely if necessary.
