

Did you know?

🐝 There are 24 species of bumblebee which currently live in the UK and just one species of honeybee. The 'Big Seven' (see overleaf) are widespread throughout the UK, but there are many others, eight of which are a conservation priority species, because of their low numbers

🐝 Bumblebees do not make honey

🐝 Only female bumblebees (the queen and workers) have a sting. Males do not

🐝 Bumblebees are not aggressive and rarely sting

🐝 Bumblebee species have different-shaped tongues, which are suited to foraging from different shapes of flower. The garden bumblebee, *Bombus hortorum* has the longest tongue at around 1.5 cm and can forage nectar from flowers with long corollas, that other bees cannot reach.



🐝 Bumblebees are most active in spring, summer and autumn, but some species can even be seen in winter. Their hair helps to keep them warm, but they also use their muscles to shiver and warm up their bodies even at low temperatures

🐝 Growing a wide variety of nectar-rich flowers is vital to provide nectar across the year and for all bee species. Gardens, windowboxes, allotments and pots can all provide crucial refuelling points

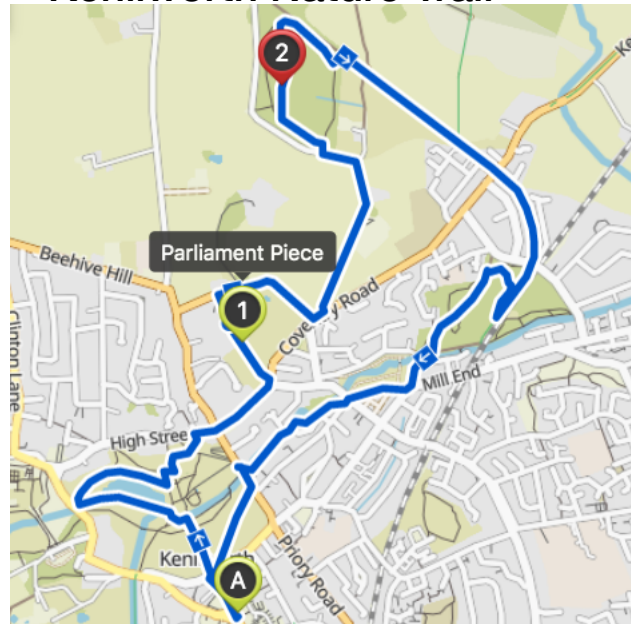

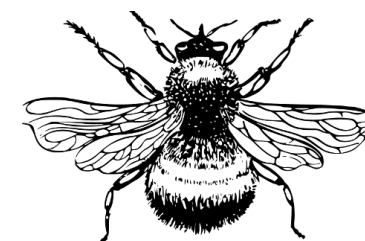
