The Myton Hospices care for and support people aged 18+, from the minute they receive the diagnosis that their illness is incurable to the end of their life. We also provide support for their loved ones.

Services We Provide



- Inpatient Units at our Hospices in Coventry and Warwick
- Patient and Carer Wellbeing Services
- Myton at Home service covering Warwick, Leamington, Rugby and surrounding villages
- Palliative Care Support Hub at Rugby
- Counselling including a specialist bereavement service for children and young people
- Therapies allied to health services: Lymphoedema, Complementary Therapy, Occupational Therapy, Physiotherapy
- Spiritual and pastoral support
- Citizen's Advice
- Helpline in conjunction with Marie Curie

Our Impact

Last year we cared for 1,966 people

- 1,582 Patients
- 384 Family members
- This is a 14.4% increase on previous years



We have been working actively to reach wider groups across all communities and to support people earlier in their diagnosis.
